Ask the Experts: New Videos on ITP Management Added

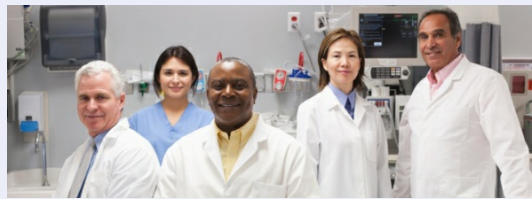
